

Economic Overview Plant City Region



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Demographic Profile

In 2010, the population in the Plant City Region^{*} was 713,033.

The region has a civilian labor force of 345,717 with a participation rate of 59.4%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Plant City Region^{*}, 23.6% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 28.2% in the nation.

The median household income in the Plant City Region^{*} is \$51,182 and the median house value is \$128,170.



Employment Trends


As of 2016Q4, total employment for the Plant City Region was 276,171 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2016Q4, employment increased 2.7% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4.

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Plant City Region earned annual wages of \$42,790 as of 2016Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.4% in the region during the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$53,271 in the nation as of 2016Q4.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4.



Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 8.8% lower in Plant City Region than the U.S. average.



The Cost of Living Index is developed by Chmura Economics & Analytics and is updated quarterly.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Plant City Region is Retail Trade, employing 42,973 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Health Care and Social Assistance (37,063 workers) and Accommodation and Food Services (26,507). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (LQ = 2.07), Management of Companies and Enterprises (1.51), and Retail Trade (1.43).



Total Workers for Plant City Region by Industry

Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4.

Sectors in the Plant City Region with the highest average wages per worker are Utilities (\$93,889), Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$72,431), and Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$68,235). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Retail Trade (+6,485 jobs), Accommodation and Food Services (+5,184), and Construction (+4,248).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the Plant City Region is projected to expand by 23,759 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +1.9% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+7,870 jobs), Retail Trade (+3,848), and Construction (+2,986).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Plant City Region is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 42,607 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (34,085 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (26,459). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 2.69), Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (1.25), and Construction and Extraction Occupations (1.24).

Occupation groups in the Plant City Region with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$109,300), Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$78,100), and Legal Occupations (\$76,700). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.5% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 11.6% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the Plant City Region is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+3,072 jobs) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (+2,446). Over the same period, the highest replacement demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Sales and Related Occupations (11,479 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (10,529).



Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2016Q2, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4. Wages by occupation are as of 2015 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Plant City Region with the highest relative concentration is Agricultural with a location quotient of 2.41. This cluster employs 10,073 workers in the region with an average wage of \$33,835. Employment in the Agricultural cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.5% per year over the next ten years.



Location quotient and average wage data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, imputed where necessary, and updated through 2016Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2016Q4. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Plant City Region is projected to grow 0.8% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.6% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.0% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.2% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is replacement demand?

Replacement demand is the number of jobs required due to replacements—retirements and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that replacement demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The replacement demand shown in this report may also be understated; thus, it can be taken to be a minimum measure of the number of workers who will need to be trained for the occupation due to replacements. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the replacement demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a *competitive advantage* in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 820 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 23 major groups, 96 minor groups, and 449 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.

About This Report
